Adam and Julie Martin minister to the **Akolet church of Papua New Guinea**. They are currently working on the Akolet translation from the USA. The Martins were able to connect with the rest of the translation team through a video call to complete the translation check for the book of Hebrews. "The Akolet New Testament is right at 50% completed, with another 30% in various stages of completion."

Praise God for the progress made in the Akolet translation and the impact it is having in the lives of the Akolet people, particularly in the life of translation helper Toni. Pray that the Akolet believers would continue to take the gospel to their neighbours. Pray for unity in the Akolet church.

Wednesday **God is Opening New Doors in Asia Pacific**

David and Bethanna serve in **Asia Pacific**. They received their missionary training from Ethnos Canada. "Our team recently got back from a survey trip to the 'M' People. Although we have not had a chance to visit all the villages in that language group, we did talk to the king in that area as well as one of the village leaders, and they both seemed very open to our coming and living there so that we can learn their language and culture. We are very excited about this opportunity, and we would appreciate your prayers that the Lord would keep this door open and that He would give us wisdom as we proceed in trying to get official permission to live there."

Friday **A Successful Outreach in Papua New Guinea**

Jonathan and Susan Kopf, currently serving from the USA, minister to the **Hewa people of Papua New Guinea (PNG)**. "We have heard that the Hewa believers are continuing to meet together, and on top of that, they recently assisted believers from the Malaumanda language group in an evangelistic outreach to a remote village where a few Hewa men live. We recently heard through the Malaumanda missionaries that the first phase of the outreach was successful and that many from that village are now professing faith in Jesus. We heard that this outreach caused so much excitement in surrounding language groups that there are men from the sometimes-volatile Paiela language group that are again sending requests to our Hewa believers asking for missionaries to come live with them to translate the Bible and teach them. ... Please pray the Lord raises up more workers for the harvest in remote PNG villages."
