



## Monday **“Of course I will trust in Jesus.” —New Believer, West Africa**

Aaron and Amy, along with co-workers Guy and Keyla, minister among the “G” people of West Africa. Over 10 months, the team taught from Genesis to Revelation. In their last lesson, they taught about the new heaven and the new earth and summarized God’s plan throughout Scriptures. One woman responded to the gospel by saying, “Of course I will trust in Jesus.” It seems that the rest are not yet ready to believe. “It looks [as if] there is still more soil to till, more seeds to be planted until the crop is ripe for harvest. ... Pray that God will continue to work in the hearts of those who came to the teaching and will keep reminding them of what they heard.”

## Tuesday **Pray for Bible Translation Efforts, Tobo People, Papua New Guinea**

Chad and Janeene Mankins, serving itinerantly, minister among the Tobo people of Papua New Guinea. Jason and Nisae Williamson minister among the Iski people of Papua New Guinea. The initial church outreach in village “S” is almost finished, and “people are believing!” One man who was hearing Truth for the first time said, “Jesus, the promised One, is the only way I can be made right with God. I have put my faith in this talk!” Praise God for those who have heard and believed. “The new believers will continue to meet as a group there (under the teaching of [Iski] Bible teachers [from the first village]) with the hope that they will become the new local church body.” Pray for those who have not yet understood and believed.

## Thursday **“I can’t stop reading it. It is going straight to my heart.”**

Levi and Robyn Lenz and their co-workers Daniel and Rachel Hulley minister among the North Wahgi people of Papua New Guinea. The church recently held a New Testament dedication. One woman who “is very religious but not a born-again believer” immediately began reading in the book of Matthew and said, “I can’t stop reading it. It is going straight to my heart.” Pray that as she reads Scripture, she would understand Truth and put her faith in Christ. Since receiving the New Testaments, many people have asked to hear the chronological teaching and to start another literacy class. Pray for the team as they discuss with the church how to meet these needs.

## Friday **Pray for the Chimane Church in Bolivia**

Dan and Judy Burke minister among the Chimane people of Bolivia. Each year, they take a break from teaching discipleship courses from January to March and “completely focus our efforts on developing new materials. Dan is writing a commentary ... for the book of James in Chimane. I (Judy) am continuing to write up new lessons in my series of chronological Bible lessons for the Chimane women.” Pray for wisdom as they strive to develop materials that are accurate and understandable. Pray for the Chimane elders as they “visit, evangelize and encourage believers” during a particularly “difficult season” of sickness and flooding.
